

M-3 Resurfacing Clinton, Macomb and Chesterfield Townships

Macomb County April - July 2025

What Is Being Done?

The Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) will be resurfacing 5 miles of M-3 (Gratiot Avenue/23 Mile Road), upgrading sidewalk curb ramps, improving drainage, repairing guardrail, and restriping permanent pavement markings in the townships of Clinton, Macomb and Chesterfield.

When Will This Be Done?

Work begins in April and is expected to be finished by the end of July.

How Will Traffic Be Affected?

Motorists should expect daily shoulder and turn lane closures for sidewalk repairs and nightly single-lane closures for asphalt milling and resurfacing on M-3

(Gratiot Avenue) from Sandpiper Drive to M-3 (23 Mile Road).

Nightly directional closures will occur on M-3 (23 Mile Road) from M-3 (Gratiot Avenue) to I-94 for up to one week (each direction) during milling and resurfacing on 23 Mile Road. One lane of eastbound traffic will be open while the westbound lanes are closed and traffic detoured onto 21 Mile Road via I-94; or two lanes of westbound traffic will be open while the eastbound lanes are closed and traffic detoured. There will also be intermittent traffic impacts on the M-3 intersections at 21 Mile and 23 Mile roads, and the I-94 interchange ramps at 21 Mile and 23 Mile roads.

Business and pedestrian access will be maintained throughout the project.

Long-term Benefits

This project will extend the life of the roadway and improve the ride quality and safety of the M-3 corridor.
